Area Boys & Girls Clubs kids create winning art for new Martin's Earth Month reusable totes.

The top artist at each Club was chosen, and the four winning designs have been reproduced in full color on one of the two available bag designs. Each winner has also received a laptop computer from Martin's as their prize.

The green totes will be available at displays featured in the Flower Markets at all Martin's Super Markets. As with other Martin's totes and plastic bags, customers will earn a 5¢ credit at checkout each time they reuse their *Kids Caring For Our Earth* tote.
